Care for the Operated Extremity: Keep your dressing clean and dry. For bathing, cover the dressing with a plastic bag and secure it so water doesn't drip into the bag. Keep your arm elevated above the level of your heart to decrease swelling. Avoid walking with your arm down by your side. You may apply ice to the operative site for 15-20 minutes at a time. Don't apply ice directly to the skin. Do not remove your dressing until seen back in the office for your follow-up appointment. You may remove your dressing in days and cover the incision with a band aid. After dressing is removed, the incision may get wet, but do not soak it. Pat dry and cover with a band aid.
